## "Peter Witnesses and Testifies"

Acts 10:44 – Acts 11:18

## The Gentiles Baptized in Truth, Spirit and Water

<sup>44</sup> While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who heard the word. <sup>45</sup> And those of the circumcision who believed were astonished, as many as came with Peter, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also. <sup>46</sup> For they heard them speak with tongues and magnify God.

Then Peter answered, <sup>47</sup> "Can anyone forbid water, that these should not be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we *have?*" <sup>48</sup> And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord. Then they asked him to stay a few days.

## **Peter Testifies**

**11** Now the apostles and brethren who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also received the word of God. <sup>2</sup> And when Peter came up to Jerusalem, those of the circumcision contended with him, <sup>3</sup> saying, "You went in to uncircumcised men and ate with them!"

<sup>4</sup> But Peter explained *it* to them in order from the beginning, saying: <sup>5</sup> "I was in the city of Joppa praying; and in a trance I saw a vision, an object descending like a great sheet, let down from heaven by four corners; and it came to me. <sup>6</sup> When I observed it intently and considered, I saw four-footed animals of the earth, wild beasts, creeping things, and birds of the air. <sup>7</sup> And I heard a voice saying to me, 'Rise, Peter; kill and eat.' <sup>8</sup> But I said, 'Not so, Lord! For nothing common or unclean has at any time entered my mouth.' <sup>9</sup> But the voice answered me again from heaven, 'What God has cleansed you must not call common.' <sup>10</sup> Now this was done three times, and all were drawn up again into heaven. <sup>11</sup> At that very moment, three men stood before the house where I was, having been sent to me from Caesarea. <sup>12</sup> Then the Spirit told me to go with them, doubting nothing. Moreover these six brethren accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. <sup>13</sup> And he told us how he had seen an angel standing in his house, who said to him, 'Send men to Joppa, and call for Simon whose surname is Peter, <sup>14</sup> who will tell you words by which you and all your household will be saved.' <sup>15</sup> And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them, as upon us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup> Then I remembered the word of the Lord, how He said, 'John indeed baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' <sup>17</sup> If therefore God gave them the same gift as *He gave* us when we believed on the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could withstand God?"

<sup>18</sup> When they heard these things they became silent; and they glorified God, saying, "Then God has also granted to the Gentiles repentance to life."

- 1. In vv. 44-48, while Peter was still speaking, something invisible must have happened within the Gentiles' hearts, but it became obvious to Peter that the Holy Spirit was poured on them.
  - a. What do you think happened within the Gentiles heart when they heard the gospel?
  - b. How was it evident to Peter that they received the Holy Spirit? (1Cor 14:2/Act 2-Penticost)
  - c. If you were baptized by the Holy Spirit, briefly share your experience of that moment.
  - d. What outwardly signs can you see that will give you an indication that someone has come to faith in Jesus?
- 2. How is Peter's action in vv. 44-48 aligned with the Matthew 28:18-20?
- 3. What did the Jewish Christians witness and how did this change their perspective of salvation?
- 4. If water baptism is not a requirement for salvation, what does it signify and why is it commanded of us who come to faith in Jesus Christ?
