Majority Rules Wrongly

¹⁹ But when her masters saw that their hope of profit was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged *them* into the marketplace to the authorities. ²⁰ And they brought them to the magistrates, and said, "These men, being Jews, exceedingly trouble our city; ²¹ and they teach customs which are not lawful for us, being Romans, to receive or observe." ²² Then the multitude rose up together against them; and the magistrates tore off their clothes and commanded *them* to be beaten with rods. ²³ And when they had laid many stripes on them, they threw *them* into prison, commanding the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴ Having received such a charge, he put them into the inner prison and fastened their feet in the stocks.

Supernatural Earthquake and Endurance

²⁵ But at midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶ Suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were loosed. ²⁷ And the keeper of the prison, awaking from sleep and seeing the prison doors open, supposing the prisoners had fled, drew his sword and was about to kill himself. ²⁸ But Paul called with a loud voice, saying, "Do yourself no harm, for we are all here."

²⁹ Then he called for a light, ran in, and fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰ And he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

³¹ So they said, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³² Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³ And he took them the same hour of the night and washed *their* stripes. And immediately he and all his *family* were baptized. ³⁴ Now when he had brought them into his house, he set food before them; and he rejoiced, having believed in God with all his household.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Think of the multitude in vv. 22.
 - Who were these people and how did they become involved with this situation?
 - Did they take up an offence for someone else? How is this dangerous and what impact did it make toward Paul and Silas, and the magistrates?
 - Share a situation where you were in the position of the "multitude", Paul and Silas, or the magistrates? How were others affected?
 - What is the best way to deal with this type of situation if you find yourself in the *multitude?* Identify some bible verses.
- 2. Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God at midnight. How is this helpful?
 - How do you overcome pain and suffering?
- 3. What can you learn from Paul and Silas when you are going through a trial?
- 4. What were indications that this was a supernatural phenomenon? What compelled Paul and Silas to stay instead of escape? How does this show Christ's love?
- 5. What action compelled the jailer to approach Paul and Silas? Have you considered how your actions are drawing others to Christ?
- 6. How can vv.31 be taken out of context?
- 7. Although Paul does not mention repentance to the jailer, what actions showed repentance?
- 8. How does enduring pain and suffering increase your faith?
