  - c. How can we apply this truth today in our own understanding of Scripture and our ability to follow Jesus?
- Grp. 3 4. How do you respond to doubts or challenges in your faith? Do you bring them to Jesus in prayer, seek guidance in Scripture, read commentaries, watch YouTube, or do you let it push you away?
- Grp. 4 5. Jesus' teachings often seem difficult or even offensive (see John 6:60-61).
  - a. Why do you think that is? What makes Jesus' message different from other religious teachings?
  - b. How should we respond when we face difficult or hard-to-understand teachings in Scripture?
  - c. What role does humility play in accepting hard teachings from Jesus?
