"RAISE THE DEAD"

2018 Resurrection Day Series Studies in 1 Corinthians 15

Introduction: 1st Fruits is the last of three spring "holidays" of Israel. Having sacrificed a Passover lamb three days prior and purified the city of leaven, the High Priest waved the first sprig of barley wheat heavenward. At His first coming the Son of God, Jesus of Nazareth, fulfilled the prophetic requirement of all three feast days:

- 1) Jesus is our sacrifice Passover Lamb
- 2) He removes and cleanses our lives of sin/leaven and
- 3) He is the first of a whole harvest of people that will rise up from the grave.

Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24 and John 20 record the miraculous resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ. Many wonderful facts about our future resurrection can be learned from those eye-witness accounts and from the Holy Spirit's teachings through Apostle Paul in *1 Corinthians 15*.

About AD 56 the church in Corinth, Greece had been infiltrated by false teachers who underminded the unity, morality and theology of the Christians. *1 Corinthians 15* is about the absolute necessity and certainty of a literal, physical resurrection for the followers of Jesus Christ. The first 34 verses prove the resurrection theologically, logically, and historically. Verses 35 through 58 prove it scientifically and prophetically.
